

HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL



HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL

In October 1980, Mr Hooi Choo Wah, then Principal of Mountbatten Government Chinese Primary School, was informed by the Ministry of Education that he was to be the Principal of Ang Mo Kio North Primary School. Mr Hooi accepted the appointment and Mr Leong Weng On, his Vice-Principal at Mountbatten Chinese, also decided to join him in running Ang Mo Kio North Primary School.

Ang Mo Kio North Primary School was to turn out to be special in many ways. Firstly, it began its first year proper (1981) housed in a secondary school - Mayflower Secondary School at Ang Mo Kio Avenue 3. At this time, the building of Ang Mo Kio North Primary School at Avenue 9 had not progressed beyond the piling stage! Secondly, it was a bold experiment never before seen or heard of in Singapore's educational history - it had 43 Primary One classes (not to mention another three Primary Two classes) with a combined enrolment of more than 1800 pupils drawn from five different schools: Ang Mo Kio North Primary (8), Chong De (10), Da Qiao (8), Hong Dao (10) and Jing Shan (7). The three Primary Two classes were among the six that Ai Tong was holding for Ang Mo Kio Primary throughout 1980. This means that in effect Ang Mo Kio North Primary had been in existence as early as January 1980. As if this was not unique enough, we also had another Primary One class in Ang Mo Kio Secondary School throughout 1981.

The problems of a school with so many Primary One classes were tremendous in the beginning but Mr Hooi and Mr Leong and their two Senior Assistants, Mr Chua Chin Au and Mr Fun Swi Tong, together with the rest of the teaching staff, numbering 64 altogether, took the challenge well. The school ran smoothly, dispelling our initial fears and those of some Ministry of Education officials that the experiment might not work well. In fact, it had so impressed the public that a Straits Times team came to the school to take photographs for their write-up.

Towards the end of 1981, the buildings of Ang Mo Kio North Primary, Chong De, Hong Dao, Da Qiao and Jing Shan were in various stages of completion. We returned the holding classes back to the various schools while at the same time we also prepared to move to our new home at Avenue 9. Mr Leong and Mr Chua were officially informed that they were to be respectively the Principal and Senior Assistant of Chong De Primary School. Mr Tan Whuang Nam joined Ang Mo Kio North Primary in December 1981 as the new Vice-Principal. Mr Sim Beng Siang was appointed Senior Assistant.

On 22 December 1981, the building of Ang Mo Kio North Primary was officially handed over by the Public Works Department. The staff of Ang Mo Kio North Primary, greatly reduced in number now, began to help in the big shift from Mayflower Secondary to the new premises.

For the first time at last, we had a home that we could call our own. When we began our first day on 3 January 1982, we had 36 classes from Primary One to Primary Five. Ai Tong had returned the remaining three Primary Two classes to us. Ang Mo Kio Secondary also returned the one Primary One class to us. In 1982 we were holding four Primary One classes for Ang Mo Kio South Primary (later renamed Li Hua Primary). In September 1982 when Li Hua moved to its new premises beside Ang Mo Kio North Primary, we returned the four Primary One classes to them.

1983 saw Ang Mo Kio North Primary with 42 classes from Primary One to Primary Six, staffed by 59 teachers. This year is an important one for us: we will be presenting our first batch of Primary Six pupils for the Primary School Leaving Examination. Come 15 September 1983, the school will be celebrating its official opening.
